Willoughby job with Murphy draws Dems' fire

Oakland County is looking for some-one to cajole grants, shared revenue and favoral laws out of state and fed-

eral legislators.

And who knows better how to do that

than a former legislator?
That's the reasoning of Oakland
County Executive Daniel Murphy, who
this week is expected to name fellow
Republican L. Jean Willoughby to a
\$24,035 job on his staff as federal and
state aid coordinator.
Some commissioners' made it clear
they would prefer it go to a non-artisan
civil servant rather than an opponent.

CREATION OF the new post was approved 14-9 Thursday by the Oakland County Board of Commissioners.

Only Republicans voted yes. One Republicans, Sue Kain of Clawson, Joined eight Democratis in opposition.

Calling it the "Willoughby Unemployment Compensation Bill." Democratic opponents urged the position be filled through the county merit system instead of political patronage.

"We cannot continue to give a Irlend a job when we're cutting-out deputies and hours," said Commissioner Betty Fortino, D-Pontitae, calling the appointment a "sham."

WILLOUGHBY, who was not at the commission meeting, confirmed that she expects to get the appointment. But she would have applied for it even if the position had been a merit system

the position had been a merit system one.

"I feel it's perfectly acceptable elther way," explained Willoughby, a
state representative for one term. "The
job is what I wanted, I think it's exactly
where I should be."

The resolution also did away with the
grants development administrator poatition, which paid \$38,097 to \$43,009.

Russ Martin, who held that merit system job, is now the county's management and budget director.

DEPUTY COUNTY Executive Pa-trick Nowak, who in an interview wouldn't deny Willoughby will be given the job, said the coordinator will have less responsibility and a lower salary than Martin had.

than Martin had.

"There are a lot less grants to administer," Nowak explained, adding,
Murpby wants a legislative lobbyist
rather than a budget analyst for the
new position.

"Clearly this person will be lobbying

on behalf of the administration and should be part of its thinking — not just a civil servant."

Nowak said he would find "the Democrats' railing to be a little less hollow if they were as critical of their administration in Lansing. The litany of political appointees is as long as your arm."

SPEAKING AGAINST the resolution were Democrate Dennis Aaron of Oak Park, Fortino, Hubert Price Jr. of Pontiac and James A. Doyon of Madison Helghts.

Aaron suggested the lobbyist position is intended to help Murphy win re-election. He also proceed doubts about the executive's choice for the job.

"When you come up with a job description like this and a candidate like this, you're not talking about priorities or good government. You're just feathering your own next, 'Aaron said.

Aaron criticized Willoughd's ability to work with Democrats and even some Republicans during her terry in Lansling.

REPUBLICAN Commissioner Mari-lyn Goeling of Bloomfield Hills object-ed to Aaron's personal criticism of Wil-loughby. "I think it's ungentlemanly and uncalled for to cast slurs on a per-

son not here."
Price offered an amendment to

place the job under the merit system. "At minimum, we want to assure residents of Oakland County that this will be filled on a fair basis," he explained. Doyno called the upcoming appointment the "worst kept secret in Oakland County," adding:

"I do belleve firmly that it is being created for a person rather than a function. If the function is needed, it should be merit. If it's political patronage, it should be up front."

WHILE COMMISSIONERS were de-bating, the mother of six was on her way home from New York where her oldest son had surgery.

"I'm just glad it's settled," said Wil-loughby, named Mother of the Year in 1982 by the Michigan Mothers Associa-tion. "Even though I knew there was a possibility of it coming up, my mind was on other things."

The 58-year-old Republican became active in party politics after returning to college at age 47. A registered nurse, she has a bachelor's degree in communications and a master's degree in political science.

"Journalism brings you into current events, and by the time I finished my master's I was really involved," she said.
