

Farmington Country Club hosts golf qualifier

Farmington Country Club will be the site of sectional qualifying on Friday, Sept. 1, for the 39th United States Senior Amateur Championship. Tournament play will consist of 18 holes of stroke play. The number of qualifying places available at the Farmington course will be determined by the United States Golf Association (USGA) after the entry deadline.

The 1983 U.S. Senior Amateur championship will be held Sept. 19-24 at the Crooked Stick Golf Club in Carmel, Ind. It is conducted by the United States Golf Association.

The 1982 tournament, held in Tucson, Ariz., attracted a record 1,041 entries. Alton Dubon of Los Angeles won the championship, thus becoming the first black person ever to win the Senior Amateur Championship.

The tournament is open to male amateur golfers who will have reached their 55th birthday by Sept. 8 and have handicaps not more than 10 strokes under the USGA Golf Handicap System. Entry applications must be received by 5 p.m. Aug. 17 at the address of the USGA (Golf House, Far Hills, N.J., 07931).

On a related note, sectional qualifying for the third United States Mid-Amateur Championship will be held Tuesday, Sept. 13, at the Dearborn Country Club. The tourney is open to amateurs who will have reached their 25th birthday by Sept. 13, 1983, and have handicaps not more than five strokes under the USGA Handicap System.

Entry deadline for this tournament is 5 p.m. Aug. 24.

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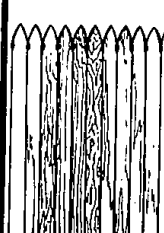
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
