Hills company found in violation of Fair Labor Act

Great Lakes Recreation Co., bead-quartered in Farmington Hills and op-erating bowling establishments throughout the Detroit area, has been found in violation of the Fair Labor Standards Act by Judge Philip Pratt in the Federal District Court in Detroit.

In a findings of fact and conclusion issued by the court, Judge Pratt found that the firm has violated the minimum wage, overtime pay and record keeping provisions of the act, which is administered by the U.S. Department of Labor's Employment Standards Administration (ESA). Wage and Hour Division.

The court concluded that most of the managers and assistant managers at

the Great Lakes establishments are not exempt from the Fair Labor Standards Act and are therefore entitled to minimum wage and overtime pay.

The court also determined that all violations of the act which occurred on or after May 22, 1972, were willful. A determination of financial relief (back-pay) for the employees involved will be made at a later time. No date has been set for that determination.
