TYPIST/CLERICAL WORKER — To do office work and typing for two mornings or afternoons a week for three weeks beginning Sept. 6. Needed by OCVB.

NURSING INSTRUCTORS — RNs, LPNs can upgrade job skills with American Red Cross course (fee charged), then train people to take care of the sick in their home. Must be 21. Will teach one 18-hour course per year. Parenthood class instructions also needed.

PARENTING INSTRUCTORS —

volunteers

Over 21 social worker or counselor with B.A. or associate degree needed by American Red Cross to work with parents and young children. Fee for instructor's course.

TEACH SENIORS — American Red Cross needs mature (over 35) persons to work with seniors to lead group discussion and teach simple skills. Need to teach four one-hour classes. Fee for training.

MOTHER'S AID INSTRUCTIONS — Seventeen-year-olds and up needed to teach mother's aides by American Red Cross. Also that age group needed for various duties, i.e. taking BP and Health Fair work. Small fee for training.

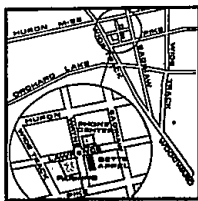
