## Bill insures pet replacement

A bill that would provide consumers with a replacement animal or money refund if the pet they purchase is diseased or congenitally defective, has been introduced by state Rep. Sandy Brotherton, R-Farmington. The measure (H.B. 4814) would also

allow purchasers to inspect an animal's health certificate before any sale is completed.

"I think it's important that these consumer protection measures be enacted," Brotherton said. "The buying of a pet is one of the most important selections a person can make, and both the animals and purchasers should be protected."

In addition, Brotherton's bill would require the Department of Agriculture to devise a set of recommendations on the appropriate care of cats and dogs to be distributed to purchasers by pet shop owners. These recommendations would include that the purchaser of a cat or dog should have the animal examined by a veterinarian within two days of purchase.

Brotherton said that under his bill should a cat or dog be found diseased or congenitally defective by a licensed veterinarian, the pet shop owner would be required to replace the animal with an animal of equal value, or refund the purchase price.

The bill has been referred to the House Consumers Committee for further consideration.

## Perception expands in industrial park

Perception, The Machine Vision Company, has announced it will move its corporate headquarters and facilities in September to a 40,000-square-foot building in the Farmington Free-way Industrial Park.

Perception, which manufactures computerized optical inspection systems for automated manufacturing processes, will be located at 23855 Research Park Drive.

Major auto industry orders for the company's new MV-300 three-dimensional gauging system prompted the need for a larger facility, said Dwight

D. Carlson, president of Perception. The MV-300 statistically measures the surface dimensions of stamped sheet metal parts and assemblies and gauges their fit during the assembly process which helps automakers produce vehicles with higher levels of quality and appearance.

The new building gives Perception an additional 28,000 square feet of manufacturing and office area.

The new facility is less than one quarter mile from Perception's current headquarters.

mence, Pine Bluff, Ark., was the commencement speaker.

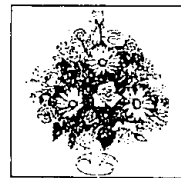

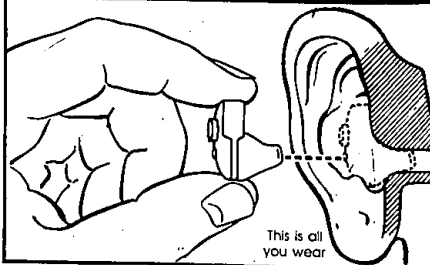
