equipment replacement, at a reduced cost because the purchaser of the EDC-issued bonds is exempt from paying state or federal taxes on the interest earned. Unlike tax-exemption certifi-

cates, Deadman said, EDC bonds do not let firms off the hook for taxes other than on interest earned.

ONCE THE Weatherford-Walker developers receive the green light from

council, Deadman said, they "will go out and find someone or a (leading) institution that is willing to buy the bonds."

The EDC bonds may be sold to either an insurance company, savings and loan or bank, he said. Generally, Deadman added, retail bonds are not sold to the public.
Once the bonds are sold to an insti-

tution, the institution's officials must then select a trustee who will then "dole out the money as the project (shopping center) is built," Deadman said.

The developer starts building the project "on his own equity at first, rather than receiving the entire \$4.8 million at the start of the project."
