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Men's Club open season

The Farmington Community Center Men's Club opens a new season at noon Thursday. Meetings continue in the center, 24705 Farmington Road, on the third Thursday of each month.

The group formed one year ago to provide informative and social activities for men of Farmington/Farmington Hills and surrounding areas," said Harold Gibson, a member of the group's planning committee.

News of the group spread, and the attendance record grew to approximately 80 men. One of the attractions has been the diversity of the club's speakers. There has been something to please everyone, such as Ed Barnes, travel editor for AAA Magazine; Johannes Spreen, Oakland County Sheriff; Dr. Ed Sickafus, physicist; Ernie Harwell, sports broadcaster; and Philip Power, founder and chairman of the Suburban Communications Corporation.

Thursday's program is on the development and strife in Central America, presented by Dr. Stuart M. Bundy, president of Henry Ford Community College.

Bundy's experience on the development of these countries stems from his educational missionary work as co-director and later president of the

Evangelical Schools of Central America.

Following the massive earthquake in Guatemala in February 1976, Dr. Bundy was invited by the Ministry of Education of the Republic of Guatemala to serve on relief missions to demolished educational institutions and as a consultant on earthquake-resistant educational construction.

Upon his return to the states, he served as president of Palo Verde College and vice president of Cerritos College in California. He assumed his current position at Henry Ford Community College in 1972. Since then his innovative proposals at the college have resulted in the establishment of the UAW Ford National Development and Training Center and an automation-robotics program.

Bundy's service to the community was acknowledged by Dearborn Bar Association when he was awarded the Liberty Bell Award. His interests in Central America's development continues as he serves as a member of the Board of Overseers of the Latin American Institute.
