In the last two school years, Walled Lake teachers have negotiated one of the largest salary increases in Oakhand County. In 1981-82, they received a 9.52-percent salary hite, the eighth largest increase in the county, (Hazel Park topped the list with an 11.25-percent increase).

IN 1982-83, Walled Lake teachers received a 10-percent increase, while Farmington teachers negotiated 9.5 percent, West Bloomfield 7.5 percent, Novi 5.5 percent and Huron Valley 10

A beginning teacher with a master's degree earned \$18,955 in Walled Lake last year. With the board's suggested reduction, a teacher on the same level would make about \$14,875 this year.

This year, a beginning teacher with a master's degree will earn \$17,246 in Farmington, \$17,259 in Novi; and \$17,163 in West Bloomfield.


