## Bikers called to join new club

Two avid cyclists are looking for high school and college students who are interested in participating in group bicycling trips.

Jim Walden, a resident of Union Lake and an engineer with General Motors, who has biked for a couple of years both long and short distances, will act as the club's leader and chief bicycle mechanic.

He will be assisted by Mary Harmala, a French teacher and resident of Farmington Hills, who was what she termed "your average Sunday biker" until 1979. That was the year she began planning for an entire summer of biking through the Hawaiian Islands.

Since then she's made half- and full-day trips throughout the tri-county area as well as week-long trips to northern Michigan.

Both Walden and Harmala have participated in numerous bikeathons and marathons for various charities which have put them into contact with biking activities, biking safety precautions and biking information they will pass on to the club members.

NUCLEUS of the club will be several teens from Farmington High School whose cycling group there last year has not been resumed for the 1982-83 season.

Those wishing to join the group need only a decent bike, at least a 10 speed. Members will be given options for half-day, full-day or overnight jaunts, and will plan their own trip agenda for the year.

Walden said he expects the group would be making about six fall and six spring trips of whatever distance the members choose.

The two will pick a date and time for an orientation meeting in the Farmington area to form the group after they hear from interested bikers, who are asked to call 478-9226.
