

Farmington Community Band begins 18th season

Farmington Community Band (FCB) from 7:30-9:30 p.m. has begun its 18th season with rehearsal Tuesday in Harrison High School. Conductor R. Paul Barber invites any interested adults who play a band instrument to join the band.

Membership is open to all adults. Students in grades 9-13 may audition.

The concert season will begin Sunday, Nov. 8, with a salute to the Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association on its 50th anniversary. Guest conductor and state president Ted Smith will share the podium with Barber.

"Bell-A-Ringing" Tuesday, Dec. 15, will feature the Bell Choir of Nardin Park Methodist Church with conductor Mel Rookus. The concert band also will present seasonal favorites.

The newest FCB tradition, the Valentine dinner-dance, is set for Friday, Feb. 10, 1984. The popular fund-raiser will begin at 6:30 p.m. with cocktail hour, buffet and dancing to the sounds of the FCB dance band. Tickets are again \$10 per person and will be available in November.

"Marching Into Spring" will be an international sampling of marches Tuesday, March 22. This concert will feature selections from Beethoven to Sousa.

The annual concert honoring older persons and handicapped persons Sunday, March 6, will be "Strictly American" and will feature the Farmington Community Chorus with director Jim Whitten. This concert is presented in cooperation with the Farmington Area Arts Commission and in conjunction with National Music Week.

All concerts are presented in Harrison High School auditorium, 29995 W. 13 Mile. Tickets are available at the door, \$1 for students and older persons; \$2 for adults, and \$5 for a family.

Additional appearances for the band are Sunday, Dec. 11, in Westminster Presbyterian Church of Detroit; Saturday, Jan. 28, Festival of Community Bands at Twelve Oaks and Sunday in the Park June 10 in Farmington Community Center, with the Farmington Youth Band.

Founded in 1966, the band with a membership of 70, includes many special ensembles, Jazz-Dance Band, the Clarinet Choir, the Brass Ensemble, and the Mixed Band.

A 30-member board of directors representing many aspects of the community administers the band. It is operated and paid for by state and local grants, and donations, in-kind services, the Farmington Area Arts Commission, and in cooperation with Farmington Public Schools.

Oakland Community College students may obtain college credit through Farmington Community Band membership.

President for the 1983-84 season is Bill Harrison. Vice presidents are Michael Barnard and Fern Barber.

Other officers are Erin DeCooks, Betty Babcock and Michael Wiese. Mary Orwig is business manager, and Alan Babcock is equipment manager, assisted by Dan Hughes. Librarians are Bridget Cashin and Amy Orwig.

Other subjects covered in "Money Mystique" are IRAs, the examination of one's life insurance, the use of living trusts and estate planning.
