

# Northville strikers end Stevenson win streak

The longest soccer winning streak in the state is over.

Northville took advantage of a wet field, scoring twice within a span of three minutes in the second half Thursday night to upset defending state Class A boys' champ Livonia Stevenson, 2-1.

The visiting Spartans, missing coach Pete Scerri, who was out because of a family obligation, lost for the first time

in 25 games. Ralph Aulicino, Scerri's top assistant, coached the team in his absence.

At 8:45, Northville's Steve Starcevic made it 1-1 on a penalty kick after a Stevenson player was whistled for a pushing foul inside the box.

The Mustangs then tallied the game-winning three minutes later as Dave Warmuth beat goalie Terry Harshfield after a mad scramble in front of the Spartan net.

"I was a little bit shocked when I

heard," said Scerri, who had to pick up his son from North Carolina at the airport. "It shows that they're humans and sometimes it happens. It's a good thing it happened early."

"I think we still have a pretty good team."

The win gives Northville a 4-1-1 overall season record, while Stevenson dropped to 3-1-0.
