CITY OF FARMINGTON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS (Summary)

A regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order at 8:02 p.m. by Mayor Bennett on September 19, 1983, in Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan.

PRESENT: Mayor Bennett, Councilmen Hartsock, Mitchell, Tupper.

ABSENT: Councilman Yoder.

CITY OFFICIALS PRESENT: City Manager Deadman, Director Billing, Director Selfert, City Attorney Kelly, City Clerk Bushey.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

Minutes of other Boards were received and/or filed.

Council continued the variance for construction of a hard-surfaced parking lot at the Farmington Distribution Center until the building is redeveloped for retail or commercial use.

September was designated as LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS MONTH in Farmington.

Council adopted a resolution certifying approval of the project area designation, establishing project district area boundaries, and appointing additional directors for the Farmington/Nine Mile Associates Project.

Ordinance No. C-510-83 was introduced, which would rezone 23301 Orchard Lake Road from R-1, One Family Residential to R-1-O, One Family Office District.

Council ratified the new three-year contract between the City and AFSCME Local 1168.

The City Manager's Agreement was amended.

Council reviewed a progress report on the Caddell Drain.

Monthly bills were approved for payment.

Absent: Hughes. Others present: City Manager Savage, City Clerk Cairns, Assistant City Manager Costick, Finance Director Roesch and City Attorney Poehlman.

Minutes of September 12 and 19, 1983, were approved as presented.

Council enacted Property Identification Ordinance No. C-10-83 to facilitate the delivery of emergency services and summary was approved for publication.

Council approved Agreement to amend Consent Judgment for property at northwest corner of 11 Mile and Orchard Lake Roads.

Council enacted Ordinance No. C-11-83, amending Article I of Chapter 53 instituting certain requirements for the sale of Christmas trees and summary was approved for publication.

Management Audit and Electronic Data Processing Study was awarded to Plantie and Moran.

Resolutions were confirmed to the Housing Rehabilitation Loan Board as follows: Dave Draizin, Robert Hajdu, Nassie Kurvija and Gilbert Seeley. Reappointment to Farmington Hills Historical Commission are: Kathryn Briggs, Floyd Cairns and Albert Moehlman and new appointment of John J. Willyard.

Council approved amending SAD 173 regarding Lots 349 and 350 paving assessments for Richland Gardens Section 38.

Petitions from Westhill opposing extension of Westhill into Hollywood Subdivision were accepted for consideration and was referred to City Manager for review.

Council approved name change for a Class C Liquor License from Tommy Thomas Drapery Company to Venus Investment, Inc. located at 28910-28922 Orchard Lake Road.

Contract for building renovations to Fire Stations No. 1, No. 2, No. 3 and No. 4 was awarded to Jabo Construction in the amount of \$16,015.

Contract was approved with Oakland County for improvements to Haggerty and 12 Mile Intersections.

Council approved contract with Oakland County for signal modernization at Orchard Lake Road between Twelve Mile Road and Oakland Community College.

Council approved Special Assessment District for Street Tree Planting Program for Orchard Lake Road.

Contract was awarded to Detroit Concrete Products for resurfacing 13 Mile Road from Orchard Road to just west of Farmington Road in the amount of \$18,250.75.

Council granted authority to City Manager to take action in the matter of Grand Haggerty's business license.

Meeting adjourned at 10:40 P.M.
