Cooling weather has warded the fishes' appetites.

Anglers are taking catfish on Pontiac Lake with nightcrawlers, good bass and panfish at night on both Lake Orion and Kent Lake and perch from Lake St. Clair's Anchor Bay.

For walleyes, try wading or casting from the shore of the St. Clair River between Marysville and St. Clair. They're in the 2-4 pound class. If drift-fishing is your style, try the St. Clair River from Algoac to St. Clair.

Little action except a few crappies at Belleville Lake.

The storage area is fenced and gated. Each stall has a numbered buried anchor to which you may secure your boat and trailer with your own chain, cable and locks. Price is \$45 for the period from Oct. 15 to March 31.
