Middlebelt school sold for office space

Farmington's School District has received its asking price for the closed Middlebelt Elementary School.

Universal Suites, a newly formed Farmington Hills firm, has offered the

district \$410,000 for the 39,000-square-foot building, which was closed last June because of declining enrollment in the district.

Anthony Gallina, a partner in Universal Suites, said he plans to convert the building to offices if the sale is approved by the board of education and

the land can be rezoned to the proper classification.

The building was first offered for sale on a "sealed-bid" basis with the bids due on Aug. 16, according to William Prisk, the district's assistant superintendent for finances and services.

"No acceptable bids were received at that time, so the district continued to offer the building for sale," Prisk said.

Prisk said the offer from Universal Suites came Sept. 30. "It was the minimum bid we'd accept," he added.

REACHED AT his Farmington Hills office, Gallina said he planned to renovate the inside of the building for "general office use."

"I don't want to say too much right now, because one thing has to follow another for all this to happen," Gallina said. "But I can tell you that we plan to be the prime tenants. The inside will be renovated for general office use. We're going to be very selective about our tenants."

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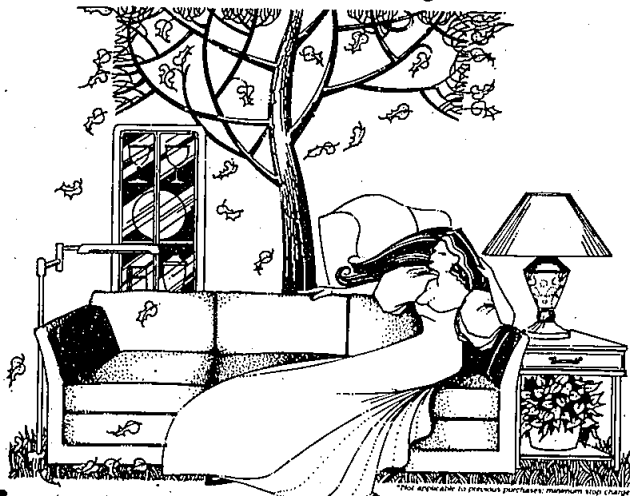
