TEN-YEAR BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION — The City of Farmington Hills will soon celebrate its tenth anniversary. Groups may contact city

hall to make reservations for a special "open house" tour during the week of Oct. 17. The city also is inviting everyone to a reception at Vladimir's 4:30-6:30 p.m. and/or dinner at the Botolph Inn at 7:30 p.m. These events are scheduled for Sunday, Oct. 23. Tickets for each event may be purchased at the Department of Special Services for \$8 and \$20 per person respectively.

HALLOWEEN HOWL — The Farmington Community Center, Farmington Community Library, YMCA and Farmington Hills Parks & Recreation will be hosting a Halloween party on Monday, Oct. 31, between 4:30-7:30 p.m. This event will be an alternative to trick or treating and there will be costume contests, hayrides, a bring-your-own-pumpkin decorating contest, a trick or treating street and more. AAA re-elects its chairman

William M. Skillman, current board member and a past president of the Automobile Club of Michigan, was re-elected to head the nearly 35-million member American Automobile Association Oct. 6 at its 81st annual meeting in Washington, D.C.

As chairman of the world's largest motorist organization, Skillman will govern national and international affairs of 188 AAA clubs in the U.S. and Canada.

Skillman, senior partner in the public accounting firm of Skillman, Zielsch and Co. of Troy, has been director of the Automobile Club of Michigan since 1967. He served as president from 1975-77.

He is the fourth Auto Club of Michigan director to serve as national AAA head.

Skillman, active in many community organizations, serves as vice president of the Boys and Girls Club of Metropolitan Detroit and the William R. Angell Foundation which manages North Manistee Island in Lake Michigan and is a director of the Detroit Zoological Society. He is a trustee of the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety and is a director of the First State Bank of Charlevoix.

A Farmington Hills resident, Skillman attended the University of Michigan and was graduated from Wayne State University in 1945.

SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS REGULAR PUBLIC HEARING
October 17, 1983

Mayor Hughes opened the regular public hearing meeting of the City Council of the City of Farmington Hills on October 17, 1983 at 7:30 P.M. Members present were: Burwell, Hughes, Lange, Soronen, Williams and Wolf. Absent: Delan. Others present: City Manager Savage, City Clerk Calma, Assistant City Manager Conlick, City Attorney Pochlin and Planning Consultant Coates.

Allie Vagstad expressed concern about residents of City who have to pay for installation of Cable TV. Staff will check into the matter and try to resolve it.

Zoning Map Amendment C83-203 (ZR 12-4-83) to rezone 1.45 acres of land on southeast corner of 13 Mile and Middlebelt from RA-1B to OS-3 was denied.

Council introduced Zoning Map Amendment C83-306 (ZR PC 15-7-83) to rezone property at 32500 Northwestern Highway from RA-2 to B-3.

Zoning Map Amendment C83-205 (ZR PC 14-7-83) was introduced to rezone property at 31618 Northwestern Highway from RA-2 to B-3.

Council introduced Zoning Map Amendment C83-308 (ZR PC 15-7-83) to rezone property at 31471-79 Northwestern Highway from RA-1 to OS-1.

Council introduced Zoning Map Amendment C83-307 (ZR PC 16-7-83) to rezone property at 31485 Northwestern Highway from RA-1 to OS-1.

Zoning Map Amendment C83-308 (ZR PC 17-7-83) to rezone property at 29905 Middlebelt from RA-1 to OS-1.

Council introduced Zoning Map Amendment C83-309 (ZR 18-7-83) to rezone property at 31821 West Twelve Mile Road from RA-1 to OS-1.

Council introduced Zoning Map Amendment C83-310 (ZR 19-7-83) to rezone 2.04 acres of land (Sidwell) 23-30-300-010 on east side of Haggerty Road, north of Nine Mile Road from RA-2 to OS-1A.

Council introduced Zoning Map Amendment C83-311 (ZR 20-7-83) was approved to November 21, 1983 at the request of proponents William Poren and Barry Glaser.

Council reapproved Preliminary Plat and Final Plat for Kendall-V Subdivision in Section 19.

Council adopted Traffic Control Order prohibiting parking at any time on both sides of Hallwood Court.

Traffic Control Order was adopted requiring all eastbound and westbound Belcrest Road traffic to yield at Belcrest Way.

Council adopted Traffic Control Order prohibiting stopping, standing or parking on school days from 8:30 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. on Nottingham Road, Aranel Road and Bonnell Hill Road, Kenbrook Elementary School.

Traffic Control Order was adopted prohibiting right turn on red traffic movement for southbound Halsted Road onto Westwood.

Council adopted Traffic Control Order for traffic control in the area of Colfax Road, between Farmington and Gill Road as follows: Northbound Cass Avenue traffic is required to stop at Colfax Road; north and southbound Planders Avenue traffic is required to stop at Colfax Road; northbound Rhonwood Drive traffic is required to stop at Colfax Road; parking will be prohibited on north and south sides of Colfax Road from Farmington Road to Gill Road at all times.

Mrs. Soronen suggested Farmington Hills contribute \$100 toward the restoration of the Statue of Liberty. City attorney will check into the matter.

Meeting adjourned at 9:30 P.M.
