Making the trip were: Al Lanson, Lakeshire principal; Richard Rutter, Beechview principal; Don Cowan, Wooddale principal; and Nicholas Abid, William Grace principal.

Some of the stands taken at the convention were: resolution against use of public funds for nonpublic schools; recognition as official of an NAESP "committee on black concerns;" resolution approving "accountability" for principals which would not inhibit experimentation; and authorization of a task force to study a written code of ethics for principals.
