**AN ARTHRITIS THAT CAN BE CURED: POLYMYALGIA RHEUMATICA**

In most instances arthritis in the elderly can be treated, but not cured. However there is an arthritic condition found among people over 70 years of age which can be completely reversed by therapy. This condition is polymyalgia rheumatica. In this disorder the muscles of the shoulders and hips become stiff and aching; this discomfort is intense and present day and night. Rest, heat, exercise, and aspirin, usually a useful drug, have little influence on polymyalgia rheumatica.
