Heat-saving program continues in the Hills

Neighborhood energy open houses continue for Farmington Hills' residents who live south of 11 Mile and

want to learn how to keep their homes warm for the winter and conserve energy dollars under their roofs.

Attend your neighborhood open house and see an infrared photograph of the front of your home showing where heat needlessly lost last winter through windows, doors and inadequately insulated walls can now be saved.

On hand at each meeting will be trained interpreters to analyze the thermogram of your home and make recommendations on low-cost/no-cost remedies for energy conservation.

In addition to viewing the thermogram, each resident will have the opportunity of discussing their energy questions with utility representatives and registering for a formal residential consumer services audit of their home.

PUBLICATIONS ON energy-saving techniques, using renewable resources, implementing new technologies and getting individual or community financial assistance will be available.
