

Christian Scientists host free lecture Nov. 12

The only answer to the endless cycle of dissatisfaction and disappointment in our experience is to lead a God-centered life rather than a self-centered life, says a Christian Science lecturer.

Ada P. Mondino of Montevideo, Uruguay, who will be speaking at 2 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 12, in First Church of Christ, Scientist, Farmington, says that as we strive for a Christy-motivated life we are fulfilled and enriched beyond anything the world offers. And, because this is the love that comes from God, maintains the lecturer, it is absolutely reliable and steady.

But this love that comes from God is not human love, says Mondino; the kind of love that is selfish and limited, including both good and evil, virtues and defects. "God's love is perfect, and since it is perfect there is no evil in it," she says.

Mondino, who is giving this lecture on behalf of First Church of Christ, Scientist, says a distinction can be made between human love and divine love.

"Divine Love always promotes the unfolding of spiritual good in ourselves and others. It makes us feel more freedom, security and peace. But if the love we are expressing makes us or others feel dependent, or hinders in some way the unfolding of our spiritual nature, then it isn't divine but a human sense of love, undependable and temporary.

"To reach a more consistent and di-

vice expression of love, we really need a change of heart that purifies our motives, and leads us toward God, Spirit," she said.

Mondino is active in the practice of Christian healing, an integral part of the teachings of the church.

Mondino's lecture, "Do You Need a Change of Heart?" is free and open to the public. A member of The Christian Science Board of Lectureship, she will be introduced by Robert Cummings. Child care is available.
