

Community center lists plans for the holidays

November and December are months of preparing for the holidays in Farmington Community Center with workshops designed for all types of celebrating, home decorating and gift giving.

Gingerbread houses add a fanciful touch to holiday decorations and Diane Ekizian teaches a quick, easy method

using graham crackers embellished with candies and frosting to look as if they took hours to make. Ekizian's two-session workshops are scheduled in November for adults and in December for young people, 10 and up.

Monday, Nov. 21, Nancy Passfield, Hill and Dale Garden Club member as well as flower show judge and holiday

decoration arranger, will teach how to create her unique Williamsburg fruit tree, to adorn the holiday table. This decoration includes fresh greens, apples, pineapples and grapes arranged on a wooden cone which may be used with other plants and fruit for year-round use.

For those who want to prepare a special dessert for friends and relatives, Dermody conducts "Holiday Desserts" on Tuesday, Dec. 6 featuring sweet treats with an ethnic flair.

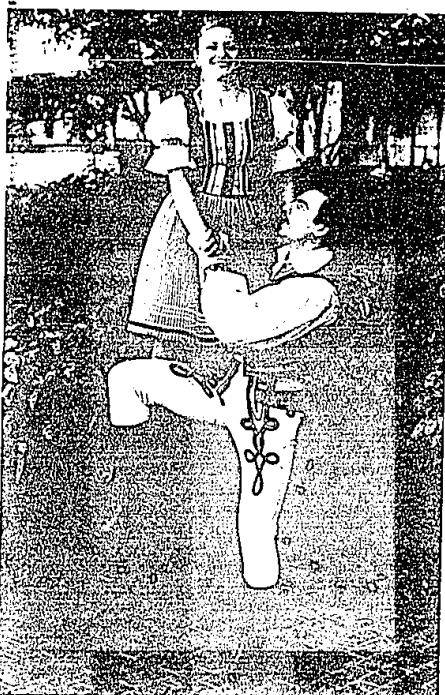

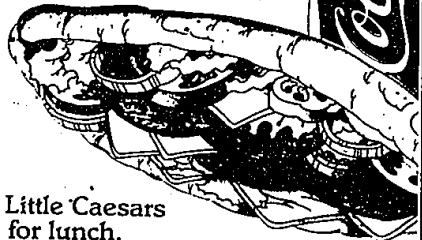
