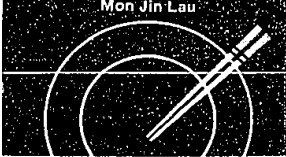

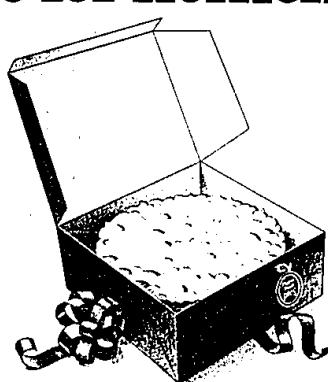
SWEET ADELINES
