A new, one-year contract containing a 5-percent raise was agreed to last week by the Clarenceville Board of Education and its 102 teachers.

The board officially endorsed the contract at its meeting Thursday. The teachers, represented by the Clarence-ville Education Association, ratified the contract by a 7-to-1 margin a day earlier.

Teachers last year accepted a wage freeze, he said. "Our teachers were very fair to the community," superintendent David McDowell said. The board also tried to be fair with the money it had." Both McDowell and Wolf agreed that the increase was made possible this year because of a new state aid bill for schools which enabled Clarenceville to collect about \$240,000 more than last year.

"IF THE STATE aid bill had not gone through, we would not have got the raise," Wolf said. "Also, if student

Starting salaries under the new contract are \$1,550 for teachers with a bachelor's degree and \$16,575 for teachers with a master's, McDowell said. After 10 years, teachers with a bachelor's degree will earn \$25,218 and teachers with a master's \$30,249.

About 90 of Clarenceville's teachers are at the top of the range in the bachelor's and master's categories, Wolf said.

McDowell said Clarenceville teach-McDowell said Clarenceville teach-ers care somewhat less than their counterparts in other districts in Oak-land and Wayne counties. (Clarence-ville represents both counties since it takes in parts of Livonia, Redford Township and Farmington Hills.) In Oakland County, where Clarence-

ville teachers' salaries rank 20th out of 28 school districts, the average mean salarior of starling teachers with a bachelor's degree is \$15,364 and with a master's \$16,778, McDowell'sald. The maximums are \$27,587 and \$31,655, re-spectively.

In Wayne County, he said, the average mean salary for starting teachers with a bachelor's degree is \$16,452 and with a master's \$18,351. The maximums are \$28,553 and \$33,376, respectively.

FRINGE BENEFITS and other items were left unchanged in the new contract which is retroactive to Aug. 28, Wolf said. During negotiations, teachers worked under the terms of the previous contract, he added.

McDowell said.
"We've been writing nothing but one-year contracts through the financial crisis," he said. "The last five contracts have been one-year contracts. It's hard to project into the future what kind of revenues we'll have next year. So to re-main solvent, we only agreed to a one-year contract."

McDowell said the CEA contract settlement was the first in the school district for the 1983-84 year, other groups requiring contracts include the Michigan Education Support Personnel Association, representing custodians, cafeteria workers and bus drivers, and the Secretarial-Clerical Association.

"The CEA contract generally sets the tope for the others," McDowell said.
