Madonna expands its med-tech curriculum

Madonna College has expanded its medical technology curriculum to provide an option for students.

A new four-year program which includes the hospital internship is being offered in addition to the traditional four-year academic plus one-year internship.

The option was provided, according to Mary Hunt, director of allied health programs at Madonna, because some students experienced difficulty in financing a fifth year following graduation. In the four-year program, students remain eligible for state and federal aid programs.

quiring completion of 125 seminar hours. Students are formally admitted to the program at the beginning of the junior year.

"Because of the nature of the curriculum requirements and the intensity of the programming," Hunt said, "it is recommended that students declare their intentions early, preferably as freshmen."

Hospitals which cooperate with Madonna in the placement of interns are Wayne County General Hospital, Hutzel Hospital and Providence Hospital.

The program was established at Madonna in 1955. Graduates of the program are administrators at Mercy College, Michigan State University and Ohio State University and also work in hospitals throughout the country.

Memory and learning spring workshop set

St. Mary's College in Orchard Lake, will host a two-day workshop on memory and learning. Joe Bancroft and Lynn Schroeder collaborate in the workshop which will offer two days of theory and practice for those interested in using alternative techniques for memorization. Friday, April 27, and Saturday, April 28, are the dates set for the conference.

"Faster learning becomes more and more necessary for everyone as the amount of information grows constantly," says Mary Anne Brennan of the college.

"The traditional methods for memorization won't enable us to absorb the amount of information that we need to learn. The Eastern Bloc countries have

been doing much to exploit the mind's ability to memorize, using whatever methods seem to be effective."

George Lozanov, a Bulgarian psychiatrist, has developed a system which he calls "sugestopedia." It is one of the whole-brain learning methods that have offered hope for a dramatic acceleration of one's ability to memorize without stress.

Bancroft, of the University of Toronto, has been interested in Lozanov's research since 1971 when she first visited Bulgaria. Her research into Lozanov's methods has contributed directly to what those here know about suggestopedia. She has also expanded her research into other alternatives to our traditional methods for memorizing.

Schroeder is co-author of "Psychic Discoveries Behind the Iron Curtain" and "Superlearning. Founder of Superlearning, an organization which puts theory into practice in order to spread the use of such techniques, Schroeder is involved with lightening the learner's burden.
