

Still dancing

She comes back to teach

Julie Adler wanted to dance from the time she could walk, and she's still dancing vicariously more than four decades later.

A former Southfield resident, Adler, now living in California, will return for a two-day dance seminar at the Michigan Inn.

Joe Tremaine, a noted Hollywood choreographer, will teach the seminar on Saturday, Dec. 3, and Sunday, Dec. 4. The seminar will be similar to others being held across the country. A session was held last year in Southfield.

Adler, a native Detroit, taught dance to youngsters in the metropolitan area for more than 30 years. She taught her first dance class at age 12. In 1939, when she was 15, she staged her first dance recital.

"It was at the YMCA on Withersell in Detroit, and later we did several at the Masonic Temple and ATV Institute."

In 1941, she opened her first dance school in the Linwood-Davison area of Detroit. Eighteen years later, she reopened on Wyoming and Curtis.

LATER, THERE WERE schools in Oak Park, Harper Woods and finally,

on Greenfield and Lincoln in Oak Park.

"These schools span an era from 1941 to 1980 during which I produced and choreographed 40 dance recitals, presented benefits for the Children's Leukemia Foundation in Southfield and presented my students on TV shows in Detroit and Canada."

Adler has been married to Ed Spargo for 37 years. They have four children: Harley, Laurie, Gary and Randy. In 1967, the family moved to Los Angeles.

"Stubborn dedication pushed me to continue my operation of the dance studios. So every four to six weeks, I commuted 1,500 miles to spend two weeks coaching and directing my faculty."

"I wanted my students' instruction to still be the best to be had anywhere, and I loved them and cared about them."

Then, in 1979, due to the illness of her father, Joseph Adler, former executive Fire Chief of the Detroit Fire Department, she retired from the business.

"It was my most difficult decision."

SOON AFTER her departure from:

the studios, Adler underwent serious knee surgery that meant the end of her personal time on dance floors.

"I was compelled to find other avenues to spread my knowledge of dance, which is how my new career evolved."

Adler met Joe Tremaine 15 years ago in a Hollywood dance class and had instant rapport, respect and friendship, she said. The two later teamed up to present the Tremaine Dance Conventions, sessions like the one planned next weekend at the Michigan Inn.

For Adler, it was a new venture that would allow her to continue to educate young dancers all over the country, something she loves to do.

Tremaine and an all-Hollywood faculty of choreographers will instruct young dancers in jazz, tap and ballet with specific classes in technique, choreography, musical comedy, routines and other topics.

Guest teacher for seminars for 15 years, Tremaine has produced his own workshops for three years.

HE IS a former member of the faculty of the University of California-Irvine and other colleges and universities.

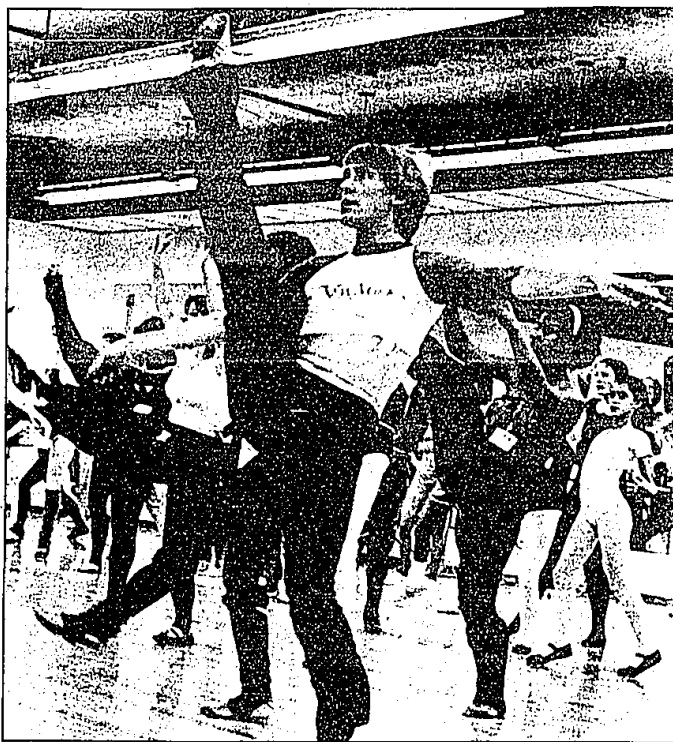
Tremaine has choreographed for Raquel Welch, Diana Ross, Barry Manilow, Connie Stevens and others. He has coached Mary Tyler Moore, Olivia Newton-John, Linda Ronstadt, Goldie Hawn and Ann-Margret.

He has film credits for Cindy Williams of "Laverne and Shirley" and has worked on TV shows and specials and many commercials. He owns a large dance center that instructs more than 1,500 students weekly.

At the close of the Michigan Inn seminar, a number of teacher awards will be presented. Tremaine will select six talented dancers to receive scholarships to his center in Hollywood.

A 7 p.m. cocktail party on Saturday night is planned for Tremaine's faculty, teachers and assistant teachers at the hotel.
