Dancers model hair designs

Dance and hair design blended on center stage when Hudson's Beauty Salons presented "Hair to Motion" in St. Andrew's Hall in downtown Detroit.

Dancers, attired in leotards and bodywear from Hudson's, performed everything from the jitterbug to jazz and ballet while showing off hairstyles and cosmetics.

Farmington Hills residents who won auditions to participate in the show were Deanna Gorecki, Ginny Kiraly, Gayle Goode and Danielle Geryan. They were among the 40 dancers and models selected.

Hairstyles were long and short, some with fullness and some without, in order to offer options for various moods and occasions. The two strongest looks were versions of the one-length bob and new, softer, layered styles.

The one-length bobs ranged from chin length to just above the shoulder. Most included either a bang or layering in the front to create fullness around the face.

Layered looks were usually swept off the face on the sides with soft curls falling on the forehead and nape of the neck. Longer versions were cut to maximize the style's movement. Texture was achieved by cutting to emphasize the hair's own natural wave or a perm

set was used to give hair the desired fullness.

In general, men's looks were short, often clipper cut in the back to achieve tailored, masculine lines. Sometimes

fullness was left to fall forward on the forehead, reminiscent of the '60s.

The show was received enthusiastically by an audience of over 400.

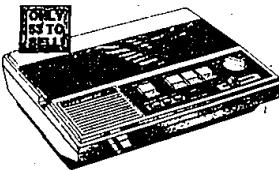
The election took place during the district's annual meeting, hosted by Northwest Unitarian Universalist Church in Southfield.
