## **Orford Quartet** deserves attention

Among the world's top string quartets that deserve attention is the Orford String Quartet. If this name so far has not been as frequently mentioned as some of the other renowned quartets, this situation is rapidly changing.

This group was funded in 1985 in Quebec. It into only Canada's most prominent string quartet, but it is internationally recognized as one of the top groups. It has received rave reviews in major publications in this country, including the New York Times, as well as in Canada and Europe. Cross, who has been teaching at Eastern Michigan University since 1986, is a native of Manchester, England. He received the distinguished faculty award in 1881, and in 1882 chaired a business meeting at the American

Theater Association Convention where he delivered a paper on his latest work, "Spectacolar Doings at the Adelphi Theatre."

Together with another professor at Eastern, Alfred, Nelson, Cross is recording the history of the London stage in the early 1800s gleaning the data from old play bills from the Adelphi Theatre. The two professors also are following through and discovering how many times a particibate play was performed at the theater, who the actors were, who direbted and wrote the plays, following, the different actors and plays through each season. Their research is so, thorough, that they've even listed the changes in the casts.
