Jury to decide if teen planned dad's murder

An Oakland County Circuit Cour-jury is expected to begin deliberating today and perhaps rule this week on the fate of 18-year-old Karl Geisler accused of killing his father on Dec. 4

1892.

The case will go to the all-woman jury after it receives instructions from trial Judge Prancis O'Brien. The Judge is atset to deliver those instructions when the trial renumes today.

The court is expected to give the Jury a wide-range of alternative charges to consider, including first and second degree murder and manishaphter, in arriving at its verdict in the Bloomfield Township case.

Gelaier is accused of breaking into his own house on Old Mill, murdering his father Frederick Gelaier with a gun, stabbling his stepmother Sandra Gelaier, then robbing them of the money they had on hand.

"IT'S A QUESTION of intent,"

Modelski told jurors in his opening atatement. "There's no doubt that Karl Gelsler shot the gun that caused his father to die.
"The question is, what was on his miod," said Modelski.
Prosecutor John Slevin entered as evidence a confession by Gelsler made shortly after the incident, and attempted to prove through witnesses that the Andower High School student planned and executed the murder of his father.

Geisler — a lanky, pale youth with curly hair who appeared to be taking notes on a legal pact throughout the trial — did not testify in his own defense. The defense put three witnesses on the stand — the youth's mother, Gay Ritchle, whom the victim divorted three years earlier to marry Sandra Geisler; Dr. Emanuel Tanay, psychiatrist and clinical professor of psychiatry at Wayne State University; and Dr. Kenneth Adams, chief psychologist at Henry Ford Rospital in Detroit.

TANAY AND Adams, who separately examined and evaluated Getsier at the direction of the court, testified this week that the youth was not capable of premeditating the murder of his father.

Tanay said he "found no basis for an insanity defense" under Michigan law, but "Karl does suffer from mental illness."
