

# Hickey back, Hawks win

His name won't appear in many of the newspaper accounts. He didn't lead the team in scoring. He didn't lead the team in rebounds.

About all point-guard Brian Hickey did in his first sustained action since returning to the lineup was lead the Farmington Harrison basketball team to their first victory of the season, a 70-59 thumping of Livonia Franklin Tuesday night.

"The starting team really pulled together both offensively and defensively," said Harrison coach Mike Teachman. "We played very smart and didn't turn the ball over."

That was due, in part, to Hickey's return. The senior, who has been recovering from mononucleosis, scored seven points and contributed six assists directing the Hawk attack.

John Miller and Dave Quarles will be the names that most frequently appear in the newspaper accounts and deservedly so. Miller scored a game-high 25 points and grabbed 13 re-

bounds. Quarles added 15 points and seven rebounds.

The Hawks out-rebounded Franklin 46-37. Harrison (1-2) raced to a 21-10 first-quarter lead. It was 37-22 at the half. The Hawks rolled up another 21-10 spurt in the third quarter to erase any doubt.

Franklin (1-3) got 17 points from Dave Carravall and 13 from Tim McGillevary.

**PONTIAC CENTRAL 72, N. FARMINGTON 63:** Tom Negoshian took an older lesson from his old tutor Tuesday.

Negoshian, North Farmington's coach, played his high school ball at

Pontiac Central under coach F. Ralph Grubb. Grubb is still giving lessons.

Grubb's team, ranked as one of the best in the state, was tested early by North, but eventually pulled away.

"They (Central) started in a r-n-n-a-n-to-man defense and we stayed even," Negoshian said. "Then they switched to a zone, and we hit a dry spell."

That dry spell resulted in a 39-23 spurt for Central in the middle quarters. North outscored Pontiac: 25-16 in the final quarter, but it was too little too late.

Junior Bob Chawlik scored 22 points and grabbed 10 rebounds for North. Sophomore Rick Anderson scored 18 and pulled down eight rebounds. All-State candidate Eli Parker was

phenomenal, leading all scorers with 31 points. North's record falls to 1-3. Central is 2-1.

**STEVENSON 59, FARMINGTON 36:** The winless Falcons gave the undefeated Spartans all they wanted for three quarters, but ran out of gas in the final eight minutes.

Trailing by eight at the half, Farmington cut Livonia Stevenson's margin to four in the third quarter. That's when the Spartans' fastbreak kicked into gear.

Stevenson outscored Farmington 22-9 in the last quarter.

Turnovers contributed to the Falcons' demise, as did Stevenson's size advantage.

Farmington (0-2) was led by Tim Carruthers' 10 points. Bob Sika scored 10 points and grabbed 11 rebounds for Stevenson (4-0). Tom Domako and Todd Baggett each tossed in 10.

# Stevenson dunks Raiders

"This was a real big win for us because North Farmington is one of the better teams in the area."

Those remarks were uttered by Livonia Stevenson boys' swim coach Doug Buckner, who watched his team open the season with a 91-81 triumph Tuesday night over the visiting Raiders.

The Spartans wrapped up the meet in the final individual event, the 100-yard breaststroke, as Steve Taormina and Kevin Murphy finished one-two with times of 1:08.4 and 1:09.2, respectively.

Kurt Hein had a big night for Stevenson, winning the 50- and 100 freestyles in 23.4 and 51.3, respectively. He also teamed up with Kevin Everhart, Kevin Murphy and Greg Deska to capture the 200 medley relay in 1:46.3.

Everhart was first in the 100 backstroke (59.0) with Roger Corderre taking second (1:03.9). Everhart also grabbed an important second in the 50 freestyle (23.5).

Stevenson's other individual winner was diver Ken Milligan (159.9 points). Somewhat overshadowed was the

performance of North's Brian Goins, who won the 200 IM (2:10.9) and set a Stevenson pool record in the 100 butterfly (54.9).

Teammate Mike Turney was equally impressive, taking the 200- and 500 freestyles in 1:55.3 and 5:10.8, respectively. Turney also anchored North's winning 400 freestyle relay squad (3:36.3).

**FARMINGTON 112½, NOVI 61½:** Everybody got into the act as the Falcons routed Novi in a nonleague meet Tuesday for their second win of the season.

Farmington took nine of 11 first places.

Eric Davis led the way by capturing the 50- and 500 freestyles in 23.66 and 5:29.4, respectively.

Other Farmington individual first places were recorded by Alec Campbell, 200 IM, 2:05.3; Andy Burns, diving, 190.9; Mike Wolfo, 100 butterfly,

1:02.4; Fred Courville, 100 freestyle, 53.7; Jay Weaver, 100 backstroke, 1:05.2; and Chris Tellerio, 100 breaststroke, 1:12.0.

Weaver, Davis, Campbell and Courville also combined to win the 200 medley relay in 1:47.1.

The Falcons travel Thursday to meet West Bloomfield. The meet starts at 7 p.m.

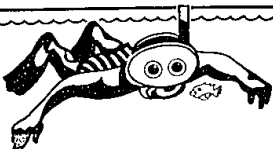
