An average of 180 persons travel down to the church every Friday to pick up the food as part of St. Alexander's Friday sharing program.

"We have people who have as home but don't have any food. They pay their rent and bills and have little left over for food. We can't feed the people for the whole week, but we try and the Friday program. Not only do the pele share food, they share their frustra-

"This lets both the needy poor and the needy rich share and everyone wins," he said.

The church also accepts any donations of food money or services like baby-aitting or carpentry work, Kreitmeyer said.

"People may not have the money or food but they may have time or skills that we need," he said. "There are all sorts of skills people could donate if they just had the place to give it to. This is that place."
