All-Americans 2 area prep stars honored

Two Observeland football players have been chosen from among the 957,000 high school football players in the country to the Bally's 1993 High School All-America team, the only national squad picked by the coaches.

Farmington Harrison's John Miller and Redford Catholic Central's Mark Messner have been named to Bally's first-team defensive squad.

The team, selected by the National High School Athletic Coaches Association, in cooperation with the Bally Manufacturing Corp., makers of video games such as Pac-Man, Space Invaders and Tron, is selected on the basis of the players' athletic and academic performance.

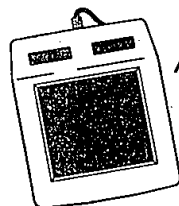
