YOUTH SWIM LESSONS — Swim instruction will be offered for beginners through advanced skill levels on Saturdays, starting Jan. 7 through Feb. 25, at North Farmington High School. Lessons require that all children be 36 inches at their chin. Advance registration is necessary in person or by mail at the Parks & Recreation office by Friday, Jan. 6.

FITNESS — Enjoy toning your body to formulated routines of exercises and dance. This activity will be taught by Noreen Yuskowatz, a popular fitness instructor from our area. The twice-a-week sessions will meet on Mondays and Wednesdays, beginning Jan. 9, 6:30-7:30 p.m. at the Pleasanton Club, 38500 Nine Mile Road. The fee for this nine-week session is \$35.

YOUTH BASKETBALL — Registration is still being accepted for this team sport at the Parks & Recreation office for the following divisions: boys, grades 4-8; girls, grades 4-8. Games will begin on Saturday, Jan. 7, for eight weeks. Registration fee is \$15 per person.

AFTER-SCHOOL RECREATION — The activity flyers will soon be distributed through the Farmington area schools or refer to the Parks & Recreation winter/spring brochure for planning your participation in the winter season of after-school recreation. Classes will include pre-school ballet,

gymnastics, ballet (youth and adult), gymnastics, mime and clowning, photography, cheerleading and pun pool, family classes and more. The sites for our winter program will be Eagle, Flanders, Forest and Kenbrook Elementary Schools. The six-week program begins the week of Jan. 16.

YOUTH BAND — The Parks & Recreation Department is sponsoring a youth concert band for children in grades 4-8 who have had at least six months prior instrumental instruction. Classes will be scheduled for Wednesdays, beginning Jan. 11, for 10 weeks. All participants must furnish their own instruments. Registration fee is \$10 per participant.

BILL KOCH SKI LEAGUE — The Bill Koch Ski League is a cross country ski club directed to boys and girls, 7-13 years of age. The league offers lessons, games, races, club patch, newsletter and more. The first session is scheduled for three consecutive Saturdays, beginning Jan. 7, 9:30-11:30 a.m. at the Glen Oaks Ski Center. The fee for the three-week session is \$23 and includes ski rental; \$13 with your own equipment.

CROSS COUNTRY SKI LESSONS — The Parks & Recreation will be offering cross country ski lessons at the Glen Oaks Ski Center. Lessons will be available on weekends for beginner and intermediate skiers, beginning Saturday, Jan. 7, at 10 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. All lessons are 1½ hours long. The fee for the lesson will be \$11, including ski rental; \$6 with your own equipment. Ski lessons are pre-registration only at the Parks & Recreation office.

CITY OF FARMINGTON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS (Summary)
A regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order at 8:00 p.m. by Mayor Yoder on December 19, 1983, in Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan.
PRESENT: Mayor Yoder, Councilmen Bennett, Hartsock, Tupper, Walker.
CITY OFFICIALS PRESENT: City Manager Deaton, Director Billing, Director Seltzer, City Attorney Kelly, City Engineer Mariner, City Clerk Busby.
Minutes of previous meeting were approved.
Minutes of other Boards were received and/or filed.
Council considered the concerns of Cass Street residents relative to difficulties in parking and driveway problems.
Councilman Tupper was appointed as contact person for the American Legion Boys' State candidate.
Council received West Bloomfield Township's resolution relative to proposed reappointment.
The City Engineer brought Council up-to-date on the Old Town Drain Project.
Council accepted a credit from Detroit Edison for imperative street lighting.
Council authorized the City Manager to represent the City on the Governmental Coalition on Public Utilities opposing rate increases requested by Detroit Edison, and approved a contribution of \$1,500 to the Coalition.
Council received and filed the Southwestern Oakland Cable Commission's Financial Report for the period ended June 30, 1983.
Monthly bills were approved for payment.
Meeting adjourned at 9:00 p.m.
