

YW Camp Opens 1970 Registration

Registrations for Camp Cavell, oldest established camp in Michigan, are being accepted by the Northwest branch YWCA, 25940 Grand River.

Girls between the ages of eight and 17 are eligible to register for the YWCA camp located on Lake Huron 4 1/2 miles north of Lexington.

Two-week sessions begin June 21, July 5, July 17, July 31, Aug. 2 and Aug. 14.

The camp site covers 55 acres of wooded land. Fully accredited by the American Camping Association, it includes a lodge, dining hall, health cabin, crafts cabins, three unit house and 24 modern living cabins, each housing a counselor and eight girls. Specialists on the staff conduct programs involving swimming, horseback riding, sports and camp craft.

Basic camp fee is \$75 for the two-week session. Further information may be obtained by calling the YWCA at KE 7-5500 or Camp Cavell office at WO 1-9220.

Need Volunteer Nurses To Assist Healthorama

Volunteer nurses are needed to help stage the United Foundation's Healthorama, scheduled June 3 to 6 in Outer Drive Hospital, Lincoln Park.

The call for registered nurses to donate a few hours for tasks like administering immunization injections came from Alfred P. Galli, director of nurses at the hospital, a member of the Peoples Community Hospital Authority.

The Healthorama, sponsored annually by the United Foundation, is the second and final one in the metropolitan area this year. The first was held recently on the State Fair grounds.



HOURS FOR THE Lincoln Park Healthorama will be 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. each of the four days. More than 20 free health tests are given. There is no charge, but the testing is done on a first-come, first-served basis, and about 500 persons can be handled each day.

Residents of Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties are eligible.

Galli, working with other hospital officials and UP leaders to finalize plans for the Healthorama, said there is an "imperative need for registered nurses to assist in several phases of the program."

"Primarily, this will involve administration of immunization injections for polio, tetanus, etc.," he said.

Tests will be offered for anemia, blood pressure, cervical cancer, diabetes, cholesterol, kidney malfunction, glaucoma, hearing, height and weight, oral cavity, vision and syphilis along with a chest x-ray which will be checked.

Hemophiliacs To Have Camp At Clear Lake

Boys who suffer from hemophilia or allied blood diseases will have an opportunity to go to a camp especially planned for them this summer.

The camp will run from June 14 to 20 at Clear Lake, with a varied camp program on the schedule.

The staff ratio will be 2:1, and there will be a doctor in attendance at all times. Blood

products will be stored in a refrigerator in the camp.

Boys between the ages of eight and 16 may attend, at a cost of \$25 registration fee per family.

The camp is located in Waterloo Recreation area, between Ann Arbor and Jackson.
