CLASSES INCLUDE:

Archery on Tuesday and Thursday, 2-4 p.m. for ages 10-12 (\$20); 4-5 p.m. for 11-18 (\$25); 6-8 p.m. for older teens and adults (\$25). Equipment will be provided, however students with their own bows may use them with the instructor's approval.

Instructor Bob Kelly is coach at Our Lady of Sorrows High School. An avid archer himself, he has much experience in archery instruction.

Art for the very young (four through seven) five days a week, June 15-July 3 from 9-10:30 a.m. Fee is \$30 all supplies included. A second session will follow from July 7-27.

Instructor Mrs. Marjorie Hughto has taught in Birmingham Schools, Buffalo's Albright Knox Art Gallery and in summer programs for Oakland Community College.

Art for eight through 11, Monday and Wednesday, 1-3 p.m. from June 22-July 8, \$15 with all materials supplied.

Instructors Miss Grace Campbell and William Harmon are art consultants for Farmington Schools and have been teaching classes at the Center for some time.

Art for junior high students, Monday through Friday, June 15-July 7 and July 7-27. Sessions are from 1-3 p.m. and the \$30 fee includes supplies.

In the first course, Mrs. Hughto will emphasize work

with clay and three dimensional sculpture of styrofoam and wire. Three-dimensional painting and drawing will be stressed during the second section.

Art for senior high, Tuesday and Thursday, June 15-July 7, 10:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m. Fee is \$15 with all supplies included.

Mrs. Hughto will repeat work of junior high course at a more advanced level.

CREATIVE STITCHERY, Tuesday and Thursday, beginning June 22 for six sessions. Ages 11 through 13, 10 a.m.-noon; 14 and over, 1-3 p.m. Fee is \$15.

Mrs. Gwen Fogarty will teach many modern embroidery stitches for decorating pillows, tote bags, skirts and plaques. Mrs. Fogarty has studied dress design and pattern making at Chicago Art Institute, has participated in many stitchery shows throughout Michigan, and has taught

Board Candidate Backs Coaches In Controversy Over Long Hair

F. J. Milliken says the decisive factor in his decision to run for the Farmington Board of Education was "the recent lack of support, given the athletic department."

Milliken, of 2376 G.H., is seeking election to a four-year term on the June 8 ballot.

The "lack of support" Milliken refers to occurred when

MILLIKEN SAYS he entered the race recognizing that being a school trustee requires "many hours of service and, if recent history holds true, probable vilification from dissident factions."

"Basically, I am a great believer in the establishment of fair regulations and subsequent enforcement of them," he said, "and this includes backing the school administration and teachers to the fullest."

"I am fully aware of the psychological effect on our youth of the murder of a president to whom they identified, unpopular wars, and our current affluence."

"These certainly are the major contributors to the unfortunate conditions that exist in our universities today."

However, parents and the school system working in concert can reverse this trend toward the complete disregard for law, authority and the property of others. There must be an end to extreme permissiveness.

"Our job is to build strength into our children—not cater to their every wish and by so doing weaken them."

MILLIKEN SAID he is concerned with the increasing tax burden on homeowners and his

objective is "the best possible education at the lowest possible cost."

"I am not one who normally volunteers," he explained. "But when I do get involved, I have a great deal of energy and dedication. Perhaps the one characteristic that describes me best is that 'I tell it like it is.'"

"I believe that the important issues that face us today require a great deal of courage and conviction. Being wishy-washy means failure, and being a middle of the roader just isn't enough."

MILLIKEN is plant distribution manager for Lincoln Mercury Division of Ford in Dearborn.

Employed with Ford Motor Co. since 1954, Milliken has trained retail personnel and for two years was in charge of all Lincoln Continental training nationwide.

After graduating from University of Maryland in 1951 with a degree in marketing and statistics, Milliken was a faculty member of University of Maryland and worked as a statistician for Brookings Institute. He also holds a master's degree in transportation.
