Advances Put Public Education In Time Of Stress -- Washburn

FARMINGTON Much of the stress in public education today is related to the challenge of keeping pace with rapid information advances, says John Washburn, III.

Washburn is seeking election to a one-year term on the Farmington Board of Education June 8 after serving as school trustee for 4½ years.

Washburn, of 21044 Birchwood, is a sales representative for Goodyear Tire & Rubber Co. and has lived in Farmington for 10 years.

"Public education finds itself

in a period of real stress socially, financially, and in its ability to keep pace with rapid advances in information and educational techniques," he says.

"The foundation established by earlier boards and staffs, along with the guidance and direction of present personnel, has each made a contribution on a course of continued progress in the Farmington schools."

"WE HAVE BEEN willing and able to accept and implement well-planned improve-

ments in our instructional programs," said Washburn, referring to Farmington School District.

"We have been ready with facilities for the hundreds of new students who enter our schools each year. We have introduced efficiencies into our business operations. And we have accomplished these things while remaining relatively free from major disruptions of our activities."

"Good schools are those schools that are making these strides. I have spent the last

4½ years as a board member working diligently and earnestly in the pursuit of good schools."

"The only commitment I make is to continue to work in this fashion and I believe that I can continue to make a contribution."

Washburn received a degree in mechanical engineering from Tufts College in 1950. He has been active in the YMCA Indian Guides, PTA, and the Farmington Little League. He is married and has three children.
