**Why Maltese Are Russian**  
How the maltese cat gained that name is said to be a mystery, for there is no blue cat indigenous to the island of Malta. It is said that probably the cats were brought there in early times from Russia or Iceland, and the color being peculiar, these cats were selected, or by superior hardiness they may have selected themselves. The Charreusse monks had blue, long-haired cats many years ago.  
One authority on cats says that the cold winters of Russia may be calculated to develop blue cats, for it is sufficiently evident that northern climates have produced most cats of that color.  
The best white cats with blue eyes come from India, and some of the best are brought from Tibet. In crossing the Himalaya mountains with these cats, carriers silt their noses to enable them to breathe with greater ease the purified atmosphere of the high altitudes. Cats with silt noses are much valued.—Detroit News.
