### Time to Cut Wood

The forest products laboratory says that the time of cutting wood has very little effect upon its durability if the timber is properly cared for afterward. Late fall or winter cutting is simplest, as the wood seasons more slowly and with less checking, and by warm weather is seasoned enough to be less susceptible to borers and fungi. There is, however, practically no difference in moisture content of green wood in winter and summer.

## NOTICE OF LETTING OF DRAIN CONTRACT.

Notice is hereby given, that I, Cassius J. Crawford, County Drain Commissioner of the County of Oakland, State of Michigan, will, on the 25th day of July, A. D. 1924, at the Hotel on Grand River Avenue in the Township of Farmington, in said County of Oakland, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon of that day, proceed to receive sealed bids for the construction of a certain Drain known and designated as "Hazel Drain," located and established in the Townships of Farmington and Southfield in said County.

Said drain is divided into 3 Sections as follows, each section setting the average depth and width as set forth: All stations are 100 feet.

Section No. 1  
Beginning at station 9 at the lower end of said drain and extending to station No. 48 plus 26 a distance of 3395 feet and having an average depth of 18.75 feet.

Section No. 2  
Includes all branches beginning at Emmett Avenue and extending north to Cowell, St. Francis, Ontario, Kensington, Avonworth, Arcambal Drive, and Gwendolyn and Eleanor Avenues. 14470 feet having an average depth of 10.47 feet.

Section No. 3  
Includes all branches beginning at Emmett Avenue and extending south in Ontario and Kensington Avenues, and D'Arcambal Drive, Gwendolyn, Eleanor, Ellen and West Avenues, and east to Grace Avenue 5815 feet and having an average depth of 5.53 feet.

In the construction of said drain the following quantities and character of the work will be required and contracts let for same:

733 feet of 30 inch crock  
1225 feet of 24 inch crock  
2595 feet of 18 inch crock  
2171 feet of 15 inch crock  
3258 feet of 12 inch crock  
17834 feet of 10 inch crock

All crock and work shall be according to the plans and specifications.

Said job will be let by sections. The section at the outlet of said Drain will be let first, and the remaining sections in their order up stream, in accordance with the diagram now on file with the other papers pertaining to said Drain, in the office of the County Drain Commissioner of the County of Oakland, to which reference may be had by all parties interested, and bids will be made and received accordingly. Contracts will be made with the lowest responsible bidder giving adequate security for the performance of the work, in the sum then and there to be fixed by me, reserving to myself the right to reject any and all bids. The date for the completion of such contract, and the terms of payment thereof, shall and will be announced at the time and place of letting.

Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check payable to "Oakland County Drain Commissioner" for 5 per cent of bid, which shall be forfeited as liquidated damages in case bidder fails to properly and completely enter into contract.

Notice is further hereby given, that at the time and place of said letting, or at such other time and place thereafter, to which I, the County Drain Commissioner aforesaid, may adjourn the same, the assessments for bonds and the lands comprised within the "Hazel Drain Special Assessment District," and the apportionments thereof will be announced by me and will be subject to review for one day, from nine o'clock in the forenoon until five o'clock in the afternoon.
