SCHOOL NUTRITION

Many teachers are now enrolling for the school nutrition series which is sent out without cost by the M. A. C. extension service, through the county home demonstration agent.

There are three years work included in the series, each of which includes seven stories, one to be given each month.

The nutrition stories for the first year are as follows: 1.—Milk story. 2.—Vegetable story. 4.—Fruit story. 5.—Good breakfast

6.—Rest story. 7.—Review story.

The material is especially adapted to the varying ages of the rural school pupils, but many requests from village and city schools are also received.

For schools that have previously used the series, a second and a third year course are now available.

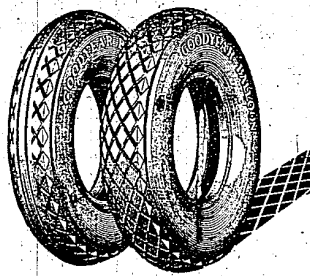

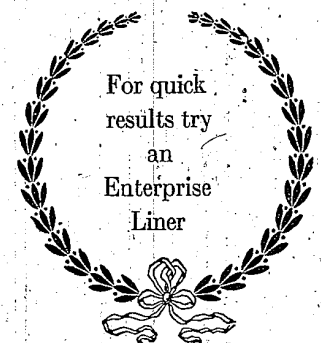

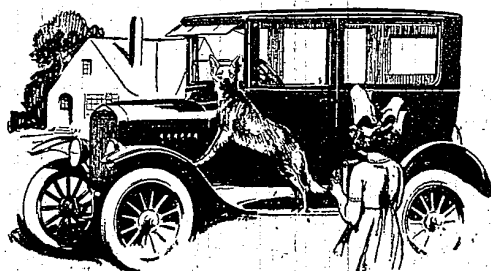
