By Busy Hands Missions Accomplished

A group of determined women and their "big brown monster" can chank up another mission accomplished.

The women are members of the Mission Club in St. Michael Catholic Church, Livonia. The monster has a huge box at the church but for two years has been receptacle for, among other donations, thousands of Betty Crocker coupons.

And the mission is a big one—acquisition of a high-powered microscope with a whopping 50,000 coupons and presentation of the equipment to Dr. John Rogers, Livonia obstetrician and gynecologist, for his work in the hospital at Belize in the British Honduras.

THE MICROSCOPE, result of long and patient coupon clipping, was presented to Dr. Rogers by the Rev. Andrew Forish, pastor of St. Michael parish. St. Michael pastor in a special meeting at the church last week. Dr. Rogers will take it with him on his next trip to Belize, where he spends part of each year. He'll also take a big quantity of bandages, instruments and surgical supplies, many of them also collected in the big brown box.

The microscope will be used for biopsies and other tissue examination in a hospital where all equipment is pitifully inadequate.

And the busy women of the St. Michael Mission Club will look around to see where else their help is needed.

women realized they had a closer-to-home mission project. They added the physician to their list.

IN THE CLUB'S early months, and was enlisted from the Wayne Western Deacons, former organization of Catholic women in this area. Catholic reorganization put an end of the deacons as such, but women in other parishes have continued to support the St. Michael club in many projects.

The list of these projects has grown, as a quick look at the report for 1969 activities will show. These included:

- Appliances and furniture picked up and delivered to needy families.
Family visitations that resulted in helping place one retarded child in a nursing home and another in the Plymouth State Home.
Ten large cartons of clothing and household supplies, sent to victims of hurricane Camille.
