The event will be June 14 at 3 p.m. at the Elks Lodge, 23666 Orchard Lake Rd.

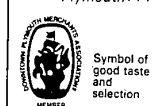
Judge Hand will give the history of the flag and Yoder will give a response.

Larkshire Books Will Cost Less

Larkshire Elementary School's PTA has developed a plan to reduce textbook costs. In the past school year, books cost an average of \$16.24 per student in the first to sixth grades.

THE LARKSHIRE plan would charge only \$8 per student beginning next fall. This fee includes all new textbooks, workbooks and consumable items purchased at the school district's bookstore.

What is so new about the plan is that students will return their books to the school at the end of each year instead of selling or keeping them.

All books now being used at Larkshire will be donated to students in next year's class.

"We sent questionnaires home to all parents and out of 600 students only nine didn't

want to participate in the program," explained Ronald Enders, the plan's originator and PTA member.

"Now we are contacting the parents to find out what their objections are and, hopefully, before school is out we will end up with 100% participation," added Enders.

LARKSHIRE'S PTA is known for coming up with new ideas. The group began the "helping hand in the window" plan. By the sign, children know if someone is at home to help them when they hurt themselves or are being followed by strangers.

The Larkshire PTA also started a low cost student picture taking program which has been taken over by the Farmington school district.

School District Operates Job Placement Service

The Farmington Public Schools have opened one of the few official placement services in high schools.

The placement program, open to students in the district and graduates, began about a week ago, according to Richard Caton of the school's vocational education department.

THE PROGRAM places students in both full time and part-time jobs.

Caton said that although there has not been much response from the community, "the response from the kids has been excellent."

About 150 students filed applications during two days to be placed by the committee.

The service operates much as a commercial placement service, rather than merely providing a list of available jobs, Caton said.

STUDENTS PICK UP applications from the vocational education department in Farmington High School at 32000 Shawwassee.

Employers seeking workers need only telephone the vocational education office at 474-6270.

Caton noted the service makes an effort to match students and the jobs, but also informs employers of the legal limitations in employing under age workers.

"The placement service is something we've been thinking about in the vocational education department, right from the director on down," Caton said.
