

"I said they've been disposed of and they said that's okay, fine. There was no pressure whatever," said Dr. Bradner.

STEMPIEN (D-35th District) said he is neither a member of Montgomery's campaign staff nor aware of what stationery was used, but that he believed it was not official House stationery.
