NEWS FROM THE STATE CAPITAL

PROPOSED AUTO AND GAS RECEIVES APPROVAL OF GOVERNOR.

Lansing—The State highway tinance program for the next two years which Gov. Greeabeck will support has been introduced in the Senate by Senator Baxter, of Grand Rapids. The program provides for a 70 cents a hundredweight tax on passebger cars, 80 cents to \$1.00 a hundred on trucks and 2 cents a gallon gasoline tax. The weight tax would be given immediate diffect to permit the Issuance of 1925 licenses and the collection of tunds of a construction program next summer. The gasoline tax would not take effect until Jan. 11 1926.

The program is so drawn as to provide sufficient money for highway purposes, no matter what steps may be taken to block the enactment of a gasoline tax. 
