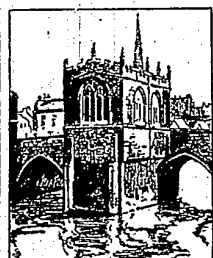

Quaint Old Structure Again House of God

An interesting ceremony was performed at Rotherham, England, a short time ago, when the historic Chapel on the Bridge, built in the Fifteenth century, and unique in many respects, was reconsecrated by the bishop of Sheffield.

The only bridge chapel comparable with the Rotherham structure is at Wakefield, but, while the latter has been rebuilt from the level of the bridge during the last century, the

fabric of the Rotherham chapel is practically the same as when it was built in 1483.

Since the dissolution of chantries at the period of the Reformation, the Rotherham chapel has passed through varying vicissitudes, having been used as an almshouse, a jail and more recently a tobaccoist's shop.

The chapel is now to be used for the purposes for which it was originally built.

Ingenious "Chink"

Among the people of Florida Lue Gim Gong is known as the "Chinese Burkhart." He has received award of the Wilder medal of the United States Department of Agriculture for developing a variety of oranges known as the Lue Gim, which has a capacity for staying on the tree several years after it is ripe without spoiling, while the tree continues to bear fruit and blossom. Another of his citrus products is the Gim Gong grapefruit which will stand several degrees more cold than the ordinary grapefruit.

Whereabouts of Jenner's Famous Cow in Dispute

A curious discussion is going on in the pages of the British Medical Journal as to the whereabouts of Doctor Jenner's cow, the famous cow which provided the lymph for the first inoculation against smallpox.

It appears that St. George's hospital in London possesses the cow's hide, but the horns attached to it are not the real ones, being made of wood.

Of the actual horns the Royal College of Physicians claims to have one, mounted on a silver plate with the inscription: "The horn of a cow given by the benefactor of man, Doctor Jenner."

There are other claimants, however. One of these, Mr. G. A. Turner, possesses a pair of horns bearing a stamp signed by Doctor Jenner's son to the effect that they are the horns of the original Jenner cow; while Dr. C. H. Jackson of York claims to have the real original horns, given by Jenner himself to Doctor Jackson's great-grandmother, whose children he had vaccinated.

It is an interesting controversy, but it is doubtful if the matter will ever be settled to the satisfaction of everybody.

PHANTOM CROOK FINALLY TAKEN

State Police Follow Alleged Criminal For Years to Solve Mystery Of Killing

A man hunt that reads like a page from Gaboriau ended when Inspector Fred Healer of the Michigan State Police leaped on his man in a Chicago Y. M. C. A. and after a brief struggle snapped the handcuffs on his wrists and proved to the world that there was such a man as Harry Wade Hill, hijacker, bootlegger, suspected bank robber and accused of murder.

For nearly four years Hill has been known as the "phantom bandit." In fact a number of police officials have firmly believed that there was no such man—that he was the creature of the imagination of Leo Sauerman and created only for the purpose of freeing Sauerman from the life imprisonment he is now serving for murder.

It was in January, 1921, that four men rapped at the door of the farm house of Alex Dombrowski in the down town district of Detroit, repeating themselves as federal officers and demanding the right to search his premises. Suspecting that the men were hijackers, rather than federal officers, Dombrowski demanded to see their search warrant. A quarrel followed and during the quarrel Dombrowski was shot and killed.

Three men were arrested for the crime, Leo Sauerman, Homer Noel and Harry Brown. At the trial of Sauerman he was positively identified by Mrs. Dombrowski and a young son of the murdered man as the man who fired the fatal shot and he was convicted and sentenced to life imprisonment in Jackson prison. Noel and Brown were convicted of complicity in the attempted robbery and the murder and given from 15 to 25 years in Jackson.

Sauerman stoutly insisted, on his innocence of the murder although admitting that he was one of the gang. The shot, he declared, was fired by Harry Hill, and he told officers that there was a marked resemblance between him and Hill which caused his identification by widow and son of the murdered man.

Inspector Healer and State Detective Ferguson finally traced Hill to Chicago from Battle Creek and Marshall, where he had been, and established a watch there. Hill was receiving mail from some of his women friends at a Chicago Y. M. C. A. and when he went there Healer and Ferguson nabbed him.

To the officers Hill admitted he had been guilty of bootlegging and that after he had been made the victim of hijackers he turned to that pursuit himself. He denied all knowledge of the Dombrowski killing, however, claiming that while he knew Dombrowski he did not know anything about the killing until some months after it had happened and then learned of it through an old paper he picked up in Battle Creek.

Big Whale Ashore

Whales are plentiful along the Oregon coast. One of the largest ever seen there, came ashore at Spencer creek, near Newport, recently. It is not known how the whale met its death. It measured 60 feet 9 inches in length. The whale's estimated weight is 60 tons.
