ANN ARBOR--About 182 demonstrators, most of them University of Michigan students, were arrested Friday after continuing a demonstration in support of demands by area welfare mothers for more money for approximately 1,200 children.

The protesters were charged with trespassing in the Washtenaw County Building. They were arraigned in an Ann Arbor municipal court and released under \$50 bonds.

Mrs. Shirley Hayward, chairman of the Ypsilanti chapter of the National Welfare Rights organization, said the group wanted payments to be based on need without an individual maximum.

However, the Washtenaw County Board of Supervisors Ways and Means Committee informed officials of the county Department of Social Services it will make available a fund of \$72,000, of which 40 per cent is to be reimbursed by the state for the purpose of providing school clothing for the children.

Now, mothers receiving Aid to Dependent Children grants will be able to apply for up to \$60 per school-age child for clothing and shoes only.

Mrs. Hayward's group has rejected the offer and she has asked Gov. Romney to intervene.

Waverly Vote To Determine School Future

WAVERTLY, MICH.—Waverly School District parents and taxpayers will go the polls Saturday to vote, for the third time, on a proposed 13.5-mill operating levy for one year.

The outcome is expected to affect immediately the status of the school district program, halted by financial problems until, at least, Monday, Sept. 16.

Voters on June 10 and July 23 defeated the millage proposal.

If the proposal passes, the board of education expects to set in motion a master contract agreement covering salary, hours, and working conditions for the district's teachers.

The contract approved in the spring by the teachers awaits board ratification in order to take effect. With the approval of the millage and the signing of the contract, classes would begin at 12:15 p.m. Monday for grades one through five and continue until 3 p.m.

All other classes would also begin on Monday at various times of the day.

SETTLEMENTS in the seven remaining school districts still fraught with teacher walkouts, as of Sunday, were not

in the coming even though negotiators met with fact finders over the weekend to try and reach agreement.

The Wayne County school districts not yet back to school are Inkster, Riverview, Trenton, Lincoln Park, Northville, Taylor and Ecorse.

Virtually all talks are at a standstill and every dispute involves more money for teachers and an agency-shop clause.

WASHINGTON--In a recent Louis Harris survey, he is quoted as saying, "Next to ending the war in Vietnam, the most urgent demand of American voters in this election season is to bring back a sense of law and order."

"By 11 to 14 per cent, the public believes law and order have broken down in this country." And by 84 to 10 per cent, Americans say they believe a "strong president can make a big difference" on this question.

Harris said, "Most Americans are inclined to take a hard-line approach to this new and emotional issue. In the view of a majority of the public, this breakdown of legal authority can be traced to four main causes:

"A growth influence in organized crime, singled out by 61 per cent as a major cause for the breakdown;
"Rogues who start riots, cited by 59 per cent of the public as one of the main causes for the current crises;

"Communists, viewed as a major cause for the disruption of order by 56 per cent of the public;

"And, the courts, named by a majority of 51 per cent as the major reason for the decline of law and order."

WASHINGTON--President Johnson is expected, by some administration officials, to arrange another session with the Vietnam war allies before he leaves the White House.

At the President at this time would want to press for congressional approval of leftover items on his program as well as seek to promote the cause of peace in Vietnam.

White House Press Secretary George Christian said he knew of no definite plans for such a meeting. But he noted that Johnson himself has said the general policy is to have a summit conference about every six months.

PRIMARY ELECTIONS, some involving the Vietnam policy and one marking Barry Goldwater's political comeback, were held Tuesday in nine states.

Party nominations for seats in the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives were voted on in Arizona, Colorado, New Hampshire, Wisconsin, Maryland, Vermont, Ohio, Rhode Island and Minnesota.

PRAGUE -- Soviet Embassy Vasily Kuznetsov has delivered a Kremlin warning to Alexander Dubcek, the Czechoslovak Communist Party leader, to purge all "counterrevolutionaries" or face extended Soviet military occupation, diplomatic sources said.

In Bratislava, Czechoslovakian Deputy Premier Gustav Husak said the government had established a joint commission with occupying Soviet Army officers to deal with problems arising from the occupation.

The announcement indicated the Czechoslovaks had made a further concession to the Soviet forces. Previously, the Czechoslovak government had avoided official contact with the occupying armies and negotiated only at the government level, thus avoiding any suggestion that local authorities were in any way answerable to Soviet military commanders.
