

Demonstration University Hills Church Classes Set Outlines New Program

St. Bernardine of Siena Catholic Church, Westland, and St. Mary's College, Orchard Lake, are among the 20 sites where free demonstration classes of the Gabriel Richard Institute leadership course will be given in coming weeks.

The St. Bernardine class will be held at 8 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 19. The church is located at 31403 Ann Arbor Trail.

The St. Mary's demonstration is set for 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 2.

The nine-session course, with over 12,000 graduates, focuses on the leadership skills techniques and attitudes needed to build a strong, dynamic and persuasive personality.

The Rev. Thomas J. Bresnahan directs the course, sponsored by the Archdiocese of Detroit and is open to men and women of all faiths at a modest, non-profit fee.

A new Farmington church, marking its first anniversary Oct. 27, has designed an evening worship program as a new way to put forth a proclamation of faith.

The University Hills Christian Reformed Church will use films, chancel dramas, music and tape in its 7 p.m. Sunday services throughout the year.

The church is moving its program this fall to Building 1 on the Orchard Ridge campus of Oakland Community College.

The building, adjacent to the east parking lot, will be used both for 11 a.m. Sunday services of a traditional nature and the evening services.

THE REV. J. HAROLD ELLIS, pastor of the church, also announced appointment of a new minister of music and dramatic arts, Roland Sharrett. The new minister is on the community affairs staff of OCC.

Rev. Ellis said the church planned to accept new members, perhaps doubling its current membership, in the anniversary service Oct. 27, and in 1969 will begin construction of a new building on a site at Farmington Road and I-96.

NEW MEANS of proclamation are considered by Rev. Ellis the central part of the church's program this year.

"Historically, proclamation of the message has been identified with the sermon," he said. "The idea has been that God speaks to man through the sermon."

AN EXAMPLE, he said, the church is considering a field trip to an observatory. The congregation would meet there "as an act of worship," he said.
