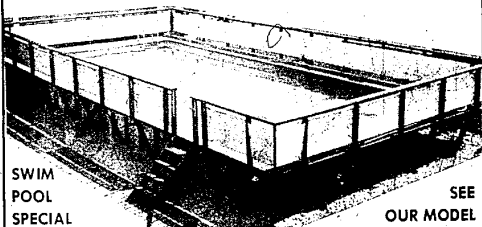

Tax Evasion Charge Made

Thomas E. Brehm, 41, of Orchard Lake, president of the T.H. Brehm Co. Inc., Farmington, was charged in Federal Court at Detroit on two counts of income tax evasion for the years 1965 and 1966.

His corporation was also charged on two counts of income tax evasion for the same years.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Loren Keenan, stated that Brehm was charged with willfully attempting to evade his income tax by over \$5,279 for the years 1965 and 1966. During those years, he failed to report income totaling \$17,121. The T.H. Brehm Co., a heating and air conditioning firm was charged also with willfully attempting to evade their income tax by over \$2,978 for the years 1965 and 1966. During those years the corporation failed to report income totaling \$18,821.

The maximum penalty for this offense is five years in prison, or \$10,000 fine, or both, with regard to each count against the individual. His corporation may also be assessed a maximum fine of \$10,000 on each count.

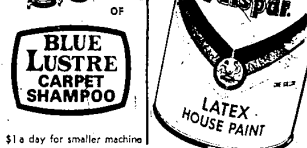
