SELLING VALUE OF GOOD LIGHTING

A storekeeper may have all else—goods, location, salesmanship—but if he has not good lighting it will avail him little.

Experiment under actual everyday business conditions, in many classes of trade, demonstrate that there is a certain standard of lighting below which trade suffers. The standard varies with the kind of goods displayed. It should never be under 10 foot-candles.

Seven out of ten stores are found underlighted—as low as four or five foot-candles. Such stores certainly cannot keep the cash register very busy.
