Much credit is due the chairman, Mrs. J. A. Miller, and the program committee, Mrs. Elmer Switzer and Mrs. Harrison Johnson.

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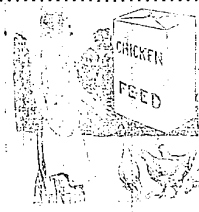
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
