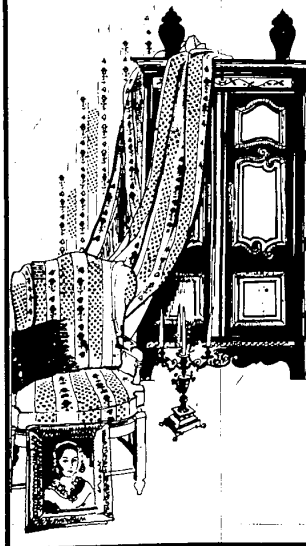

Mrs. Al Sachs of Detroit was the maid of honor and William Staman of Walled Lake was best man.

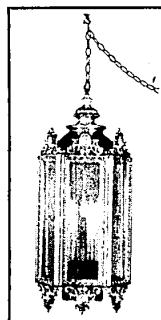
