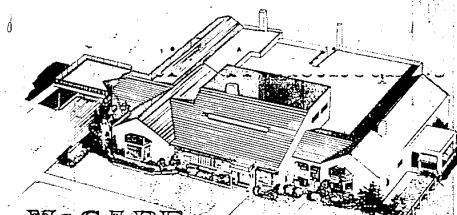

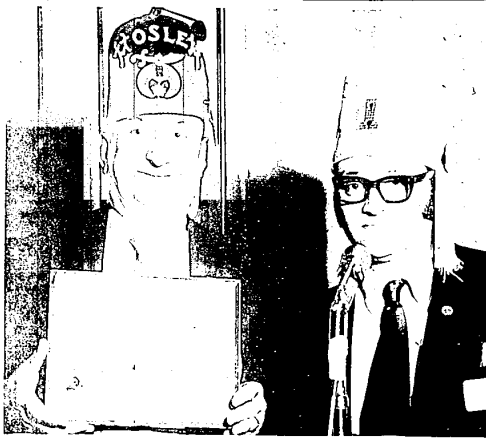

3 Area Lakes Won't Become Public Sites

FARMINGTON State Rep. Raymond L. Baker (R-Farmington) has succeeded in amending Senate Bill No. 1183 eliminating three lakes from a proposed state public access lake site program.

Baker was successful in having Pine, Green and Walnut Lakes, located in W. Bloomfield Township, removed from the language of the bill. "The State Department of Natural Resources, through its Waterways Division, is attempting to buy access land on 165 lakes in Michigan with the idea of creating boat landings to open the lakes up to the public for boating, water skiing, fishing and the like. I amended the bill at the request of the Pine Lake Homeowners Association," he said. Baker, the former chairman of the House Conservation and Recreation Committee, said

the problem lies in areas where there are no vacant properties. "In our area and on the three lakes mentioned, most lots are taken. In addition, these are not cottages but permanent residences.

"I am not necessarily opposed to the creation of public launching sites, but I do feel that they should be constructed on lakes where there is sufficient open space so as not to cause any problems with existing lake property owners. And under no circumstances would I support constructing these facilities in areas which are built up with permanent lake front residential homes," Baker said. Baker also moved to amend the bill aimed with a resolution from the West Bloomfield Township Board which objected to the proposed acquisition of the land by the State of Michigan.

Ban Parking

The Farmington City Council has approved a parking ban for all hours on Thomas St. from Warner St. west to the Civic Theater.

Thomas St. is narrow and in the past trucks parked behind the Medallion Pool Building have blocked eastbound Thomas traffic.
