POULTRY SCHOOL ATTRACTS SEVENTY-FIVE

Final examinations were given Saturday to the seventy-five men and women enrolled in the second annual poultry and judging school during the week of July 6-11, at Michigan State College.

Many of those who took the course are poultry breeders and managers of Michigan hatcheries. The course placed special emphasis on the production side of poultry, taking into account methods of culling, and judging of body conformations. Poultry leaders from the United States and Canada came to the college to give special lectures and conduct laboratory work.

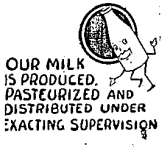
This action is brought for the purpose of quieting the title to the following described parcel of land, being in the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan:
